Terri Hasseler – "Theatre of the Oppressed Forum Performance"

• A summary of how a Faculty Innovation Grant was used to support the staging of Forum Theatre performances by the Women's Living and Learning Community GFCL students.

Ella Browning - "Professional Development Fund for Writing Workshop Faculty"

• The majority of Writing Workshop faculty are adjuncts with limited or no access to professional development opportunities. This presentation will summarize how a Faculty Innovation Grant was used to address this inequity and support instructors in Writing Workshop courses this year.

Emily Tetrault - "Welcome Back: Reacclimating Students to In-Person Learning in Bio Labs"

• An explanation of four techniques used to increase student learning, problem-solving, and accountability in response to the trauma and interrupted learning higher education students experienced during the pandemic.

Kristen Berkos – "The Specs Method of Teaching and Learning"

• This method involves students meeting certain specifications or "specs" on all assignments, which are then graded pass or fail. Students have the option to pass as many levels as they want, each level involving more difficult work. Tips will be shared for implementing this system in your classes, including course organization and pitfalls to avoid.
